

- One in four women and one in seven men are victims of intimate partner violence in their lifetime.
- Three women and one man are murdered every day by an intimate partner.
- 4,774,000 is the number of women in the U.S. that experience physical violence by an intimate partner every year.
- Intimate Partner Violence is the leading cause of female homicide and injuryrelated deaths during pregnancy.
- Children are present in more than 60% of intimate partner assaults each year.







# Common Myths about Domestic Violence in the Latino Community

- Privacy If the couple is having problems no one should interfere...
- Machismo Men have the right to abuse their wives and children.
- If you report the abuse you will get deported and/or lose your children.
- Religion Pray and God will change him or this is the man God chose for you.
- What did she do to deserve being hit?
- He is the man you chose to be with, now you have to accept the way he is....




## Family Justice Center Model
